He has served as scientific secretary to many international meetings and conferences in these fields and was also the officer responsible for the negotiation of the Convention on Nuclear Safety, the Joint Convention on the Safety of Spent Fuel Management and the Safety of Radioactive Waste Management, the Amendment to the Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material, the Code of Conduct on the Safety and Security of Radioactive Sources and the Code of Conduct on the Safety of Research Reactors.

Mr Tonhauser managed the IAEA's Legislative Assistance Programme, which provides education and training to IAEA Member States in all areas of nuclear law and assists them in drafting corresponding national legislation. More recently, he was the Scientific Secretary for the First IAEA International Conference on Nuclear Law: The Global Debate.

Mr Tonhauser is a regularly invited speaker at various academic institutions and forums, a coauthor of the IAEA's Handbook on Nuclear Law, a member of the Board of Management of the International Nuclear Law Association and a Visiting Research Professor at the National University of Singapore.
